By the end of the program, each participant will not only have a well-rounded view of the various businesses in Fairfield but also have personally connected and networked with Fairfield's top business and community leaders.

Expectations

Attendance

- Participants are expected to be present throughout the session. If a participant misses more than 15 minutes of the session, it counts as an absence.
- \diamond If a participant has more than one unexcused absence, they will <u>not</u> graduate from the program.
- \diamond $\;$ The opening session is mandatory for all participants.

Cost

- 6 If completed application is received by 3:00p.m. August 1st the participant receives the early bird registration fee.
- Registration fee increases to \$600 if received between August 1st and September 1st (Non-Member Fee is \$900)
- Program fee includes meals, bus transportation, expert presenters, materials and admission to the Chamber Annual Awards Banquet / Graduation.
- Participants dismissed for failing to fulfill program requirements, including attendance policy, will not receive a refund.

Dress Code and Rules

- Oress Code is *business casual* with *closed toe shoes*. Participants should be mindful of the weather and program agenda when selecting footwear and outerwear since walking tours include multiple facilities, both indoors and outdoors.
- All electronic devices must be turned off during the sessions. Disrespecting classmates and presenters with improper use of electronic devices will not be tolerated.

Additional Program Requirements (More information will be given at the Opening Session)

Community Service: Six volunteer (outside of class) hours are required for all participants. Organized community service days will be held for the entire class or participants may serve on their own. Activities may include working with the Greater Habitat for Humanity, assisting in a food drive, or something else the class designs. A submitted report will be required.

Board Meeting: Each participant is required to attend a minimum of one board meeting (not a board they already serve on). A submitted report will be required.

Community Project: Participants will work in teams with local organizations who have provided an application to the Fair-field Area Chamber of Commerce suggesting an idea or issue that a team can work on and help provide a solution.
